

Recently hats have become an issue around campus. Students are wearing hats on their heads, belt loops, and simply carrying them around. This is a problem as hats are a violation of the dress code and are at risk of being ruined or stolen when brought to school. Therefore, hats are not allowed to be visible at school. That means students cannot wear them anywhere on their person or carry them out in the open. If a student has a hat it will be confiscated and they will receive a consequence. Additionally “off- the-shoulder” tops are not permitted to be worn at school. Students who come to school in these tops will have to call home for new clothes and will receive a consequence. Jackets cannot be worn to cover this dress code violation.

LBJ/Brevard County Public Schools Dress Code Quick Reference Sheet

Hats, curlers, bandanas, or sunglasses (unless prescribed by doctor) are NOT to be worn inside the school building.

Strapless tops are NOT permitted at school. All straps must be at least 1 1/2 wide. NO tube tops or halter-tops

Necklines must be modest. Low cut shirts/tops are NOT allowed.

Tops MUST cover the midriff

Undergarments MUST NOT be visible

Dresses and Skirts MUST reach mid thigh

Shorts MUST have a CLEARLY VISIBLE inseam or leg of normal or reasonable length

Short Shorts are NOT permitted

Beachwear (Bathing Suits/Cover-ups) and other revealing clothes are NOT permitted in school

Excessively Large or Baggy clothing is not permitted in school.

The purpose of this reference sheet is to provide information about the dress code here at Johnson. **This is not the entire dress code but a list of main points. The entire code is available in the secondary student code of conduct book and the student planner. The entire BPS Dress Code will be enforced!**
